The season includes two subscription series plus numerous creative collaborations, all of which will be *the most fun you can have with serious music*.

ROCO in Concert

The centerpiece of the season is **ROCO in Concert**, featuring the full 40-piece chamber Orchestra with celebrated guest artists. Four weekends of family-friendly concerts are scheduled in and around the Houston area.

In its season opener, ROCO welcomes guest conductor Mei-Ann Chen, French Horn soloist, Danielle Kuhlmann and tenor, Zach Averyt, who will perform the Britten *Serenade*. Also on the program: Huang Ruo *Folksongs for Orchestra* and Bela Bartok *Suite No. 2 for Small Orchestra*.

ROCO Chamber Series

The **ROCO Chamber Concert Series** features chamber groups drawn from within the orchestra. These are intimate concerts that highlight the virtuosity of individual musicians and ensembles and invite the audience into musical conversations. This subscription series includes six Sunday afternoon performances at Gremillion &Co. Fine Art Annex. Specific dates and chamber groups will be announced at a later date.

ROCO Connections

In addition to the two subscription series, ROCO presents numerous creative collaborations with arts and community organizations. ROCO is delighted to collaborate with Houston Chamber Choir to present the annual holiday performance of Handel's Messiah on December 7, 2013, at The Church of St. John the Divine.

Additional creative collaborations include a Musical and Literary Ofrenda with Musiqa, Inprint, and Lawndale Art Center as part of the Dia de los Muertos celebration; a Yuletide holiday concert with Bayou Bend Collection and Gardens; Brass Quintet performances at the Houston Astros, West University Colonial Park and Houston Yacht Club; and three performances of Peter and the Wolf at the Houston Zoo with InterActive Theater Company. ROCO will kick off the 2013-2014 season with "Beer & Brass" at St. Arnold Brewery on Tuesday, September 10, 2013.
